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INTRODUCTION

The California Tax Education Council (CTEC) is the organization that registers non-exempt paid preparers, the second largest segment of tax preparation professionals serving California consumers.

Anyone who, for a fee, assists with or prepares a State or Federal income tax return, excluding CPAs, Attorneys and Enrolled Agents or their employees, must be registered with CTEC.

The responsibility for approving tax schools was transferred by the California State Legislature and the Governor from the California Department of Consumer Affairs to CTEC effective July 1, 1997. The Council is a nonprofit quasi public benefit corporation made up of CTEC Registered Tax Preparers, as well as appointees from nonprofit and forprofit organizations which represent tax professionals. Representatives to the Council are appointed as described in Section 22251 of the California Business & Professions Code.

The Council is charged with providing a list of approved curriculum providers, approving providers of tax education, verifying education and registering tax preparers who must also obtain a bond.

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MESSAGE FROM THE CHAIR

"Good Job." The two simple- yet most complimentary- words Senator Ted Lieu used to sum up the performance of the California Tax Education Council (CTEC) during its Sunset Review hearing earlier this year.

This was the second Sunset Review for CTEC since its inception 17 years ago. The first Sunset Review was in 2001. To say a lot has changed since then would be an understatement.

CTEC is, after all, a first of its kind. The "grand experiment" of California. It was the big question that needed an answer. Is it possible to have an industry regulate itself? Can privatization work?

In the case of the California tax preparer industry, I believe the answer is YES.

The results of CTEC, as it stands today, speak for itself.

The number of unregistered tax preparers has dropped in half. The Internal Revenue Service continually seeks guidance from CTEC on its endeavor to implement a federal tax preparer program. Public awareness regarding the CTEC program has doubled since 2009, according to an independent study conducted this year. CTEC Registered Tax Preparers (CRTPs) can register online within minutes. California consumers can verify a CRTP's legal status within seconds. And that is only a mere glimpse of CTEC's feats.

A lot of time and *heart* has gone into the CTEC program. I believe the recent passage of SB 1243 is proof of our hard work, which allows CTEC to continue for six more years before another Sunset Review is required.

None of this could have been accomplished without the support of California State Legislators, our volunteer board members, CTEC administrative staff and, of course, the due diligence of CRTPs who continue to comply with the strict standards of California.

It has been an honor to serve as your chair for the past two years. Thank you to everyone for your time, talent and treasures.




HISTORY OF CTEC

When the California Tax Education Council (CTEC) took effect in 1997, the California State Legislature provided specific duties for the council to perform: Set tax education standards, approve education

providers who meet those standards and oversee the registration of nonexempt tax preparers as a protection to California taxpayers.

STUDY ANALYZES PUBLIC AWARENESS CAMPAIGN

As part of the Sunset Review process, it was requested that the California Tax Education Council (CTEC) hire an outside research firm to measure the effectiveness of its public awareness campaign.

Until now, the most recent independent study had been conducted in 2009.

CTEC was given until June 30, 2014 to submit a complete report to the Sunset Review Legislative Committee.

The new study focused on English and Spanishspeaking consumers in Los Angeles and San Diego. The respondents were asked a number of questions to help the board get a better understanding of...


- Initial awareness of CTEC
- How consumers are finding out about CTEC
- Recall of CTEC advertising content through bus signs
- Thoughts about the advertising message


According to the survey results...

- Awareness of CTEC is up to 23 percent, which is considered "strong" awareness. In 2009, awareness was at a "moderate" ten percent.
- Of those who remembered seeing CTEC advertisements, most recalled that CTEC offers legal or registered tax preparers.
- When asked if respondents agree with the message statements, 46 percent felt that their friends and family should know about CTEC—a significant increase from 32 percent in 2009.
- 42 percent of respondents strongly agreed that "not all legal tax preparers are registered with CTEC" – a significant increase from 24 percent in 2009.
- Similar to 2009, about a third strongly agreed that the message is a good fit for CTEC and gave it a "five" rating- the highest possible rating.
- 61 percent of Hispanics also recalled seeing the bus signs in Spanish.

The full report was submitted to the Sunset Review Committee in June.

ENFORCEMENT PURSUES MORE PENALTIES


As of October 1, 2014, the Franchise Tax Board (FTB) Tax Preparer Enforcement Team has contacted 784 tax preparers statewide. Most of the contacts were made from January through May of this year.

Tax preparers who are caught preparing tax returns without a legal designation are issued a \$2,500 penalty letter from FTB and have 90 days to comply. If a tax preparer registers with CTEC by the deadline, the penalty is removed. If the tax preparer does not comply or complies late, the \$2,500

penalty stands. In the next year, if that tax preparer still fails to comply and continues to prepare tax returns, the penalty increases to \$5,000.

CTEC and FTB partnered in 2005 to help better protect California taxpayers against fraud by enforcing tax preparer compliance. All penalties collected by FTB are deposited into the state's general fund.

NOTE 1: SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Principles of Accounting and Nature of Operations

The accompanying financial statements reflect the operations for the California Tax Education Council (CTEC), which was incorporated on January 14, 1997, and commenced active operations on July 1, 1997. CTEC is a public benefit corporation and use or distribution of its assets is subject to certain restrictions.

The State of California requires that all persons in California who prepare taxes for a fee meet certain education requirements and register annually, with exception to IRS Circular 230 tax preparers. CTEC collects registration fees, verifies that tax preparers have met the education and bond requirements, issues certificates, and approves educational programs. CTEC registered 39,201 and 38,481 tax preparers in 2014 and 2013, respectively.

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amount of assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of revenue and expenses during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investments

Investments, composed of certificates of deposit, are valued at fair value. Interest earned is reported as revenue. Although all of the investments are managed through Wells Fargo Bank, who purchases, reinvests and redeems the certificates on behalf of CTEC, the individual certificates of deposits are held with various banking institutions and no single certificate exceeds the federally insured balance at any one banking institution. There is, therefore, no concentration of credit risk present.

Equipment

All equipment is recorded at historical cost if purchased or constructed. Donated assets are valued at estimated fair value on the date received. CTEC capitalizes equipment with a cost of over \$500 and an estimated life of one year or more. Costs of assets sold or retired (and the related amounts of accumulated depreciation) are eliminated from the statement of financial position in the year of sale or retirement, and the resulting gain or loss is recognized on the statement of activities and changes in net assets. Depreciation is provided on the straight-line method over the estimated useful lives of assets as follows:

Revenue Recognition

Revenue is recognized when required fee is received by CTEC.

Advertising and Promotion Costs

CTEC expenses advertising costs the first time the advertising occurs on a contract spanning less than a year in length. CTEC uses advertising to assure that the public is informed of the requirements for unlicensed tax preparers practicing in California to be registered. Advertising and promotion costs for the years ended June 30, 2014 and 2013 was \$285,647 and \$275,815, respectively. For the years ended June 30, 2014 and 2013, \$72,000 and \$72,000 was related to the hiring of an outside public relations firm, these amounts are included in advertising and promotion costs.

Enforcement

CTEC contracts with the State of California, Franchise Tax Board (FTB) for reimbursement of expenses incurred by the FTB's Fraud and Discovery Section while educating and enforcing the provisions of the Business and Professions Code Section 22250-22259 relating to the registration of tax preparers and California Revenue and Taxation Code 19167(d) and (e).

For the years ended June 30, 2014 and 2013 CTEC budgeted enforcement expenses at \$291,850 and \$310,000 respectively. Actual expenditures for the years ended June 30, 2014 and 2013 were \$200,329 and \$233,016 respectively.

Income Taxes

CTEC is exempt from income taxes under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code. Section 501(c)(3) of the code provides for the exemption of organizations that organize and operate exclusively for religious, charitable, scientific, literary or education purposes and whose net earnings do not inure to the benefit of any private shareholder or individual. The State of California recognizes this exemption.

CTEC's forms 990, Return of Organization Exempt from Income Tax, for the years ending 2013, 2012, and 2011 could be subject to examination by the IRS, generally for three years after they were filed.

NOTE 2: CASH AND CASH EQUIVALENTS

Cash and cash equivalents include bank accounts as well as certificates of deposit purchased with a maturity of three months or less. Interest income on the certificates of deposit is recorded as income when earned. At June 30, 2014, cash and cash equivalents included \$73,827 held in commercial banks of which \$250,000 was insured by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation. At June 30, 2013, cash and cash equivalents included \$93,142 held in commercial banks of which \$250,000 was insured by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation.

CTEC considers short-term highly liquid investments to be cash equivalents provided that they are both readily convertible to cash and had an original maturity of three months or less when purchased. The balance in cash and cash equivalents at June 30 include:

NOTE 5: MANAGEMENT COMPANY

Advocation Strategies Inc. (Management Company) provides management services for CTEC. CTEC pays the Management Company a flat monthly fee under the current contract of \$45,000. CTEC's current contract with the Management Company expires June 30, 2015. CTEC paid the Management Company \$540,000 and \$540,000 for the years ended June 30, 2014 and 2013 respectively.

The Management Company's fee covers all employee and employee related costs. CTEC has no employees.

NOTE 6: SUBSEQUENT EVENTS

CTEC has entered into a two year contract effective July 1, 2014 through June 30, 2016 for enforcement services provided by the FTB. The amount budgeted for this period is \$310,000 per year for a contract total of \$620,000.

CTEC has evaluated subsequent events through October 21, 2014, the date which the financial statements were available to be issued.
